Dear Friends of I Care San Antonio:

While Texas continues to lead the nation with the highest number of residents without health insurance, I Care San Antonio is on the frontlines making an impact in vision care. According to U.S. Census data, the share of Texans without health insurance–**18.4%**–is twice the national average. This statistic continues to rise as the COVID-19 pandemic lingers, causing economic challenges.

The lack of health insurance keeps many from seeking eye care and many of our patients present with complicated vision problems. I Care San Antonio recognizes the cyclical relationship between poverty and eye health. A lack of access to proper medical care increases the likelihood of poor vision which in turn creates obstacles to obtaining education and employment.

Thanks to the kindness and dedication of over 40 volunteer doctors who donate their time at the I Care Vision Center, thousands of uninsured, low income and homeless individuals receive critical eye care each year. In fact, in 2021 alone over \$1 million worth of care was donated.

The second year of the pandemic tested the resilience of our community unlike any other event in modern history. Through it all, I Care San Antonio focused on its mission and continues to build momentum. Everything our organization accomplishes is only possible because of the compassion and commitment of our volunteer doctors, board leadership and generous donors such as you.

One of the greatest joys at the I Care Vision Center is sharing the excitement as patients try on their new glasses for the first time. Whether six years old or 60, their faces light up with a sense of self confidence and gratitude. "Since receiving her glasses, my daughter has shown more interest in reading and I am pleased to see how happy she is to wear them daily," one parent wrote, adding "Thank you for the excellent care." Our patient surveys show that 71% of our young patients had improved reading levels and 100% stated an overall increase in learning. This year, with 95 schools referring students, I Care San Antonio saw our largest increase in the number of children needing eye exams.

2021 was also the year that we leaned on some humor. Thanks to the support of golf commentator, military advocate and comedian David Feherty, and all those in attendance, the O'Dark Thirty Breakfast raised over \$140,000 for our Veterans Vision Program which benefits veterans like Juanita featured on page 10. We are so grateful to David and the leadership of our board of directors featured on this year's Impact Report cover.

Thank you for your prayers for our patients and volunteer doctors throughout the pandemic; and thank you for your help in sustaining our mission to improve lives by providing complete eye care to thousands of uninsured individuals during these challenging times. We are so grateful for all you do to support I Care San Antonio.

The Gift of Sight

I Care San Antonio, founded in 1992, is a faith-based, medical non-profit organization managed primarily by volunteer doctors.

Locally, we accomplish our mission by providing complete eye care at the I Care Vision Center located next to Haven for Hope, a 22 acre homeless campus in downtown San Antonio. This program serves all low income (150% and below the federal guidelines on poverty) and homeless people in Bexar and the surrounding counties who do not have any type of health insurance or have health insurance with a deductible so high compared to their income, it acts as a barrier to receiving vision care.

Internationally, we partner with Medical Ministries International to co-sponsor over 50 medical mission trips. In addition, each year, we lead a team to assist with vision care in an impoverished country.

CHILDREN'S VISION PROGRAM

Further impact of the iCare4kids Vision program eases the financial and emotional stress of parents and caregivers who do not have eye care insurance for their children.

EYE ON DIABETES

Eye on Diabetes is a vision program that provides comprehensive eye care, from screenings to surgeries, for people with diabetes who are living in poverty.

hen it comes to the health problems deemed "epidemic" in Bexar County – diabetes is at the top of the list. The portion of adults who have diabetes has steadily increased to 14% of Bexar County's population, which amounts to nearly 284,000 people living with this debilitating disease.

The goal of the Eye on Diabetes program is to help diagnose, prevent and treat vision problems associated with diabetes. Early detection and treatment is critical in reducing vision problems and preventing blindness. According to the National Eye Institute, over 40% of individuals with diabetes will have some type of diabetic retinopathy.

This program provides a full scope of diabetic eye care including screenings, exams, surgeries and medications.

What is diabetic retinopathy?

Diabetic retinopathy affects blood vessels in the light-sensitive tissue called the retina that lines the back of the eye. It is the most common cause of vision loss among people with diabetes and the leading cause of vision impairment and blindness among working-age adults.

SENIOR VISION CARE

Serving our most vulnerable seniors

oss of vision is one of the most feared complications of aging. Approximately one in 28 U.S. adults older than 40 years is visually impaired. With a rapidly aging population, the number of persons with visual impairment in the United States and worldwide is expected to increase significantly in the next decade. Seniors with low vision are at a high risk of depression, medication errors, injury, and isolation. It is important for seniors to maintain their vision care, however, one in four Central Texas older adults have income at or below 200% of the poverty threshold and are likely to experience some type of economic hardship, thus making it difficult to afford vision care.





Helping low-income and homeless U.S. military veterans and their immediate family members access timely and complete eye care including medical, surgical and optical **... because when one member joins the military the whole family serves.**

ALL STAR EYE CARE PROGRAM



Through the All Star Eye Care Program, I Care San Antonio ensures eye health care equity to our most vulnerable veteran families. Expanding coverage

and supporting outreach efforts doesn't just help veterans – it helps their families, too. Often, it's assumed that all veterans are covered by Veteran Affair (VA) insurance, but only 47% of Texas veterans are enrolled in VA coverage. Eligibility for VA coverage varies, depending on several factors such as the years of a member's service and the level of his or her disability. Moreover, VA coverage does not usually extend to family members.

In just the third year of the launch of this program, I Care San Antonio provided a total value of care of \$317,827 with a 10% increase in patient visits – *all during a pandemic.*



PATIENT SPOTLIGHT

MEET MIGUEL

My story begins years ago. I was a professional instrumentation tech for a huge oil company. Unfortunately, in 2016, the oil field went down and my life changed forever! I got laid off and used all my savings to survive. During this time, I had no insurance, no home, and no support from anywhere. My sight started slowly deteriorating and I had no idea what to do. My vision gradually got worse and after two years I could not see out of my right eye and I could barely see out my left eye. My poor vision made it impossible to try and find employment as I could not pass the eye exam of a physical. Instead, I would get side jobs here and there mowing, handyman services, pressure washing, painting, etc. Sadly, given my situation, I would get taken advantage of and not paid properly by those who would hire me, sometimes getting paid only \$20.00 for a full day's work or not get paid at all and these jobs were few and far between.

Then, I ended up in the hospital and found out that I am diabetic. I have reached out to so many different leads trying to find support to get my eyes fixed. All I wanted was my sight back, to be able to get back to the workforce and become a contributing member of society again. I did not recognize my life. I was in the dark (literally), I was scared and knew if something did not change I would be blind forever. I was a prisoner of my circumstance. I could not drive, walk, read, work, NOTHING. After my daughter's help in finding I Care San Antonio, my life forever changed! Thanks to cataract surgery, I can now see! There are no words for the gratitude I feel for this organization, I can't thank the facility, volunteer doctors, staff, and supporters enough. I can see for the first time in years. I will never take sight for granted. I can now walk around freely and safely, seeing birds, the moon, stars, everything. I am not scared anymore! I am hopeful for my future and know I would not be where I am today without I Care San Antonio. THANK YOU!

MEET KIMBERLY

Living with a cataract on my left eye was both mentally and physically draining. I was not comfortable driving due to the lack of vision on my left side and having to turn my head to see. This, paired with my neck that has been fused on two levels, was trying. My judgment of distance was also a problem. With these impairments, I felt unsafe to drive so I had to make arrangements to have my errands taken care of which was a big part of my having independence taken away. My everyday life was also affected in many ways. I was always bumping or running into things that caused me to trip and fall. Crafting with my grandchildren has always been enjoyable but was difficult with cataracts as my lack of distance was off. We also enjoy the outdoors but not being able to see all the beauty God has given us was depressing.

Thankfully, after cataract surgery, the simple things in life are precious to me once again. I am so grateful to be able to fully enjoy spending time with my grandchildren. Also, I feel so blessed to have my independence restored and am happy to be able to safely drive myself around again. Thank you, I Care San Antonio!




