Across the nation, disparities in access to healthcare continue to be large, persistent and increasing. Because of your help, I Care San Antonio is improving our community's health equity and striving to bridge these gaps by focusing on direct patient care. I Care San Antonio continues to be the consistent vision care provider to those who cannot afford it. Our mission is to remove the barriers and fill the gap of providing complete eye care to those who are uninsured and the growing underinsured population. We are only able to accomplish these goals because of our generous donors and outstanding volunteer doctors who dedicate their time and resources both in Central Texas at the I Care Vision Center in San Antonio and internationally through our Global Medical Missions program in 19 different countries.

In this annual report, we are pleased to highlight our accomplishments in 2018 including special emphasis on three programs; **Eye on Diabetes**, **I Care 4 Kids** and **Senior Vision Care**. These programs are making a significant impact in the lives of individuals as our cover patient, Robert, stated, "the I Care Vision Center is giving me more than better vision, it is giving me hope and for that I am thankful."

Locally this year, I Care San Antonio's volunteer doctors performed over 540 major eye procedures including laser, cataract and retina surgeries. The total value of all donated eye care was over an impressive **\$1 million**. Internationally, we co-sponsored \$20 million worth of healthcare through our partnership with Medical Ministry International and the direct impact in our patients' lives is immeasurable.

We depend on, and are grateful for, all you do to support I Care San Antonio. Your kindness enables our work every day.

"We Treat. Jesus Heals"

Four simple words inscribed in a simple frame in the I Care San Antonio Vision Center waiting room at Haven for Hope. That's what got my attention when I visited the eye clinic for the first time six years ago. "Hmmm", I thought... "these people really mean it." What I have learned and experienced in the ensuing years about the work our organization does is deep, rich and real. We change lives. We save lives. In a time where it seems safer and more politically correct to be secular, our organization has chosen to swim against the tide. This letter is intended to tell you what that four-word declaration means...and doesn't mean so there's no mistaking what we are about.

People with modest or ambiguous motivations rarely accomplish great things. We've chosen to look beyond ourselves and our own means for discernment about how we can serve those in need of both routine and critically needed vision care. Serving

God by serving others has led us to opportunities we could not have imagined. From I Care's modest beginnings in 1992, we've grown to be the vision services provider of last resort for the underserved in San Antonio and many surrounding counties; dispensing over \$1 million in services in 2018. Likewise, our association with Medical Ministries International, a Canadian based nonprofit (providing medical missions in 19 countries serving more than 54,000 patients in 2018 alone) through our I Care Global Missions program was nothing we could have planned or imagined. We believe that human hands alone could not possibly have arranged the circumstances that have brought us to this place.

Despite our face-forward Christian declaration, we are not about the business of persuading people to adopt our beliefs. We do not proselytize. Rather, we try albeit imperfectly to model Christ and as the shampoo bottle says, "Shampoo,

Rinse, Repeat". It appears this practice is working well...so much so that the challenge for 2019 appears to be growth. In addition to seeing more patients in our daily clinic, more diabetic patients in our first Saturday retina clinic, and treating more children in our I Care 4 Kids program, we will be expanding a new program "All Star Eye Care for Veterans and their Families" in the Fall of 2019. And somehow I feel as if we are only scratching the surface.

Please keep I Care San Antonio in your prayers, and please support us financially. Part of our 2019 strategy is to offer more volunteer opportunities to our supporters and the public at large. The Gift of Sight

I Care San Antonio, founded in 1992, is a faith-based, medical non-profit organization managed primarily by volunteer doctors.

Locally, we accomplish our mission by providing complete eye care at the I Care Vision Center located next to the Haven for Hope campus. This program serves low income (150% and below the federal guidelines on poverty) and homeless people in Bexar and the surrounding counties who do not have any type of health insurance or have health insurance with a deductible so high compared to their income, it acts as a barrier to receiving vision care.

Internationally, we partner with Medical Ministries International to co-sponsor over 50 medical mission trips. In addition, each year, we lead a team to assist with vision care in an impoverished country.

EYE ON DIABETES

Eye on Diabetes is a vision program that provides comprehensive eye care, from screenings to surgeries, for people with diabetes living in poverty.

hen it comes to the health problems deemed "epidemic" in Bexar County – diabetes is at the top of the list. The portion of adults in Bexar County who have diabetes has steadily increased to 14% in 2014. In Bexar County that amounts to 255,600 people living with this debilitating disease.

The goal of the Eye on Diabetes program is to help diagnose, prevent and treat vision problems associated with diabetes. Early detection and treatment is critical in reducing vision problems and preventing blindness. According to the National Eye Institute, over 40% of individuals with diabetes will have some type of diabetic retinopathy.

This program provides a full scope of diabetic eye care including screenings, exams, surgeries and medications – all of which are included in the program.

Did you know? I Care SA offers free diabetic vision screenings every Wednesday morning from 8:30 am - 10:00 am. This program is made possible by generous grants from the:



What is diabetic retinopathy?

Diabetic retinopathy affects blood vessels in the light-sensitive tissue called the retina that lines the back of the eye. It is the most common cause of vision loss among people with diabetes and the leading cause of vision impairment and blindness among working-age adults.







SENIOR VISION CARE

oss of vision is one of the most feared complications of aging. Approximately one in 28 U.S. adults older than 40 years is visually impaired. With a rapidly aging population, the number of persons with visual impairment in the United States and worldwide is expected to increase significantly in the next decade. Seniors with low vision are at a high risk of depression, medication errors, injury, and isolation. It is important for seniors to maintain their vision care. However, 1 in 4 Central Texas older adults have income at or below 200% of the poverty threshold and are likely to experience some type of economic hardship, thus making it difficult to afford vision care.



I Care San Antonio, in partnership with Medical Ministry International, provides an opportunity to serve Jesus Christ by providing spiritual and compassionate healthcare in this world of need.



TO SERVE WITH GREAT ENTHUSIASM AND GREAT DEVOTION

I Care continues to work with Medical Ministry International (MMI) to help participants from North America and around the world serve in 19 countries on over 50 medical missions. Last year, over 50,000 people received vital health care. Members of I Care participated on trips last year to Bolivia, Honduras and Peru. Last February a small team journeyed to El Progresso, Honduras, to perform 53 cataract surgeries in a week. The clinic we worked in was established 22 years ago with the help of MMI and is now staffed entirely by Hondurans. Short term mission teams partner with the local team in each country to add capacity. What a blessing to work along side our brothers and sisters in Honduras. Bolivia and Peru.

I Care will again lead the two-week eye care team in Arequipa, Peru, this coming July. We have over 50 volunteers

joining the team and each person has donated around \$3,000 to participate on this mission. Many give up one or two weeks of salary or take vacation time to serve. But the blessings given and received are worth so much more. Organizing and supporting an eye campaign is a large and complex logistical program. All the supplies and equipment are obtained and transported to the city. For the Peru mission, we will be transporting 22 bags of supplies and equipment. We cannot do our work without the support of many corporations, churches and individuals. We especially want to thank the following organizations for their generous donations:

Alcon Laboratories, Inc., Allergan, Dutch Ophthalmic, Iridex Corp., Katena, Oertli, Omeros Corp., SEE International and Community Bible Church. Besides short term missions, we are working with MMI to build long term clinics in Bolivia and Peru. Property has been purchased in both countries and funding is being raised to build the clinics. Two ophthalmologists are currently in Bolivia caring for patients who will staff the clinic. Peru has an optometrist, dentist and a large physical therapy program already functioning.

Please consider supporting the fund raising efforts to bring sustainable health care to both Bolivia and Peru. You can also help fund a nurse or technician's fees to allow them to participate in a short term mission.






